The Washington County Board of Supervisors of Washington County, Nebraska, met in regular session at 3:06 PM on May 13, 2024 in the Supervisor's meeting room at the Courthouse in Blair, Nebraska. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Pilot-Tribune. A copy of the proof of publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk. Notice of the meeting was given to the members and a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda are on record at the office of the County Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice of the members. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Chairman Steve Dethlefs declared the meeting was in session and that the meeting is being recorded. Dethlefs made note that the Open Meetings Law is posted on the door and the west wall.

- 8. Hon. Francis Barron III: Discuss Juvenile Court Appointed Fees

Judge Barron stated that the fee in Washington County is \$75 per hour and the rate had not been reviewed since 2014. Comparably, Washington Co has one of the lowest rates in the state. Judges met and voted to increase the rate to \$95 per hour and it will go into effect July 1, 2024.

9. Chad Thies, Zelle HR Solutions: Discuss contract agreement for HR Services. D/PA

Thies summarized the proposal that was reviewed by the Personnel Committee and answered questions from board members. Thies said services provided in the proposal include but not limited to HR services, recruiting, compensation studies, updating handbooks and personnel files, and legal compliance. Board asked Thies to submit a contract to be reviewed by the Co Attorney and considered at the next meeting.

10. Marielle Alipio, Small Business Administration: Discuss services offered through the Small Business Administration for disaster relief.

Alipio disbursed fliers that outlined services provided by SBA for citizens affected by the recent tornado and answered questions from board members. Such services include business physical low interest disaster loans, economic injury disaster loans, and home disaster loans.

11. Sheriff Mike Robinson: Jail revenue update

Sheriff Robinson gave an update on the department and said corrections billing for the month of April totaled \$88,256.

12. Washington County Long-Term Recovery Team: request funds from Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Fund. D/PA

Pastor Glen Hudson, Reach Church, gave a brief history of what the organization does for those impacted by disasters in Washington Co such as providing shelter, food, clean-up assistance, and other various long-term needs. Most of the organization's funds go towards un-met needs after FEMA and insurance is exhausted.

WHEREAS, on April 26th, 2024, several locations in Washington County, Nebraska, experienced extreme events of tornadic activity; and

WHEREAS, as a result of this extreme event, tornado damage occurred in the unincorporated areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, said tornadic activity has damaged several structures in the unincorporated area of the County, and

WHEREAS, Washington County has enacted a Zoning Resolution, Building Code, Septic Regulations, and Floodplain Management Regulations, all of which require that permits be obtained prior to commencing construction or reconstruction; and

WHERAS, Resolutions 2005-20 and 2020-08 establishes filing fees for permits required by said regulations; and **WHERAS**, the Board of Supervisors feels it is in the best interest of the County and those property owners affected, that the filing fees for these permits to be temporarily waived.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Washington County, Nebraska, Board of Supervisors, that the filing fees for Zoning Permits, Building Permits, Septic Permits, and Floodplain Development Permits shall be waived in the following situations and subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The property is located in the tornadic activity damaged areas of the unincorporated area of Washington County, Nebraska.
- 2. The structural repairs are necessary to repair tornadic activity damage occurring during the April 26th, 2024 tornadic event.
- 3. That any structural repairs or construction not tornado damage related shall be subject to the required filing fees.
- 4. That the waiving of filing fees does not waive any other requirements of Washington County, Nebraska, Code sections.
- 5. Fees shall be waived from April 26, 2024 through April, 25, 2025.

RESOLUTION 2024-08

WHEREAS, on April 26th, 2024, several locations in Washington County, Nebraska, experienced extreme events of tornadic activity; and

WHEREAS, as a result of this extreme event, tornado damage occurred in the unincorporated areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, said tornadic activity has damaged several structures in the unincorporated area of the County, and

WHEREAS, Washington County has enacted a Zoning Resolution which does not permit the construction of an accessory structure on a parcel prior to the principal structure unless a Conditional Use Permit has been approved by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, Washington County has enacted a Zoning Resolution which does not permit temporary use of a mobile home for residential purposes during the actual construction or reconstruction of a dwelling unless a Conditional Use Permit has been approved by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors feels it is in the best interest of the County and those property owners affected, that these Conditional Use Permit requirements be temporarily waived.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Washington County, Nebraska, Board of Supervisors, that the Conditional Use Permit requirements for accessory structures prior to the principal structure and temporary use of a mobile home for residential purposes shall be waived in the following situations and subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The property is located in the tornadic activity damaged areas of the unincorporated area of Washington County, Nebraska.
- 2. The use of the accessory structure or temporary mobile home is necessary to repair tornadic activity damage occurring during the April 26, 2024 tornadic event.

- 3. Construction of an accessory structure prior to a principal structure or temporary use of a mobile home for residential purposes that are not related to tornado damage shall not be permitted unless a Conditional Use Permit has been approved by the Board of Supervisors.
- 4. That the waiving of the Conditional Use Permit requirement does not waive any other requirements of Washington County, Nebraska, Code sections.
- 5. Waivers shall only be granted during the period of April 26, 2024 through April 25, 2025 and shall be valid for a period of twenty-four months from the date a building permit has been issued.
